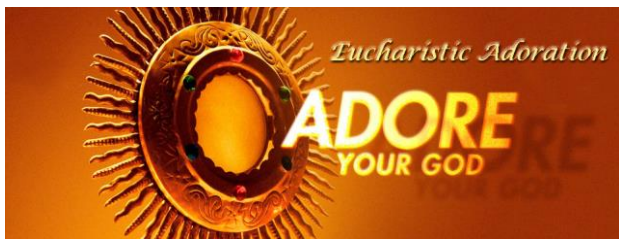

Sunday of Divine Mercy is April 8, 2018. Divine Mercy Sunday is a very special Sunday when the Divine Floodgates from Heaven are wide-opened and Jesus offers us the total forgiveness of all sins and punishment to any soul, who goes to Confession and receives Him in Holy Communion on that day. Jesus gave the instructions for the feast to Saint Faustina and she faithfully recorded them in her diary. Jesus said that "the Feast of Mercy was a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners, and He asked that "On the day of My feast, the Feast of Mercy, you will go through the whole world and bring fainting souls to the spring of My mercy. I shall heal and strengthen them." **A novena is typically nine days of prayer in preparation of a celebration of a feast day. The Novena for Divine Mercy would begin on Good Friday, March 30, 2018.** The Divine Mercy Novena and Chaplet Pamphlets and Prayer Cards are available on the front table of the church if you wish to participate in The Divine Mercy Novena of Chaplets. **The Lord specifically asked that the Chaplet be recited as a novena (nine days of prayer) and is typically recited at the three o'clock hour. Christ said "I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that they may draw therefrom strength and refreshment and whatever grace they have need of in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death.**
