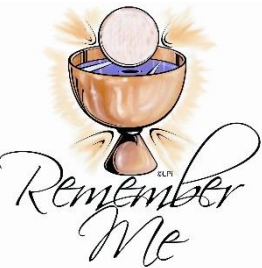

On Sunday, May 20th at 2:00pm, the Bice-Ferguson Museum will be presenting the first program of the year, and it will be an interesting and informative one, especially for our veterans and those who are WWII veterans. It will be an encore presentation by Kip Price about the "Wereth Eleven", the group of eleven African American soldiers who were captured and slaughtered as prisoners of war in Belgium during WWII. Their story was almost forgotten by history. For seventy years their files marked "secret" gathered dust in the National Archives until 1994, when at the site of their execution, a memorial was dedicated to them and to all African-American soldiers who fought in Europe. With Memorial Day being on May 28th, it is a fitting time to pay tribute to all veterans of WWII. Everyone is invited to come and listen to this very somber and fitting tribute to a piece of forgotten history. Admission is free. Refreshments will be served.
